## Mustangs finish $4^{\text {th }}$ at State Volleyball Tournament



The girls traveled to Emporia, KS to participate in the 2A volleyball state tournament. In pool play the girls defeated Bellville 25-22, 15-25, 27-25, lost to Hoxie 20-25, 20-25, and then beat Oswego 25-17, 25-23 to advance to the semi's the next day! In the third set of the first match we showed a lot of heart to battle back after being down 16-22. We finally won that set 27-25 to win the match. We also played our best match of the tournament against Oswego, knowing we had to win or go home! In the semi's we faced defending state champions Heritage Christian who we lost to 20-25, 20-25. Then we played our worst match of the tournament in the consolation game losing to Belleville 16-25, 13-25.

One of our goals for the year was to play on Saturday at the state tournament and we accomplished this goal.
To get to state we hosted sub-state at our place. We defeated Oxford 25-9, 25-7; Madison/Hamilton 25-16, 25-18 and then defeated Udall for the $4^{\text {th }}$ time 25-13, 25-23.

The Girls swept through the SCBL League going undefeated and beat Udall in the finals of the League Tournament. This is the $3^{\text {rd }}$ straight year these girls have went undefeated in league and league tournament play. The varsity girls won 5 tournaments this year and finished with a record of 40 wins with only 5 losses. This beat the old record of 37 wins in 2004. By finishing $4^{\text {th }}$ they also tied the 2004 team for the highest finish at the state tournament. They also broke the following school records with 422 aces, 18.1 ace Percentage and 1008 kills. What a legacy this group of seniors leaves!!!

Here are some of our stat leaders for the season: Gina Brown 30 blocks, Olivia Leslie 163 digs, Courtney Brown 502 serve receive attempts, Alyssa Howard with 102 aces, 429 assists and serve receive of 1.68, and Payton Gawith with 95.1 serve percentage, 21.3 ace percentage, 116.4 serve rating, 359 kills, and .369 hitting percentage.

The junior varsity and c-team finished the season with a combined record of 23 wins with only 5 losses. One of my personal goals was to prepare the underclassmen for next year. With their hard work and Coach Ratcliff's coaching, I think they helped me achieve this goal.

Coach Ratcliff and I have enjoyed the season. "What a year to remember!" Thanks for all the memories!!

The middle school regular season finale came down to the league title. Udall came to town with an unblemished record as well as us. The girls stepped up and defeated Udall 25-19, 27-25. The JV and C teams also won that night which concluded their seasons. The JV never lost a match all year which makes things look good for the future. The varsity team also had 7 of the top 12 players as underclassmen.

The varsity team was 8-0 entering into the tournament. They defeated Sedan, Central Burden, West Elk and Cedarvale/Dexter easily in pool play in two sets each. In fact the most points scored by one team for two sets was 28 to our 50. Unfortunately this was going to change.

We played Argonia in the semi's, bringing our 12-0 season into the match. Argonia spanked us 16-25, 16-25. Argonia played very well and we didn't bring our 'A " game. Things got worse in the consolation match with us losing to West Elk in 3 sets. This was the team we had beaten easily two days before.

Volleyball is not a sport for the weak hearted to coach. Sometimes there is no reason why teams play well one day and don't show up to play the next time. We went from playing our best volleyball of the year against Udall on Thursday to our worst volleyball of the year the next Monday.

It still was a real good season finishing with a 12-2 record. If the girls will work hard in the off season we should do really well next year. Coach Di and I are already looking forward to next year!!!

Cross Country had another successful season this year. We had 7 runners brave enough to try to tackle the cross country season. The kids would love Murder Mondays where we would drive out and run the Hills. We logged roughly 275 miles this season, which would be enough to run from Rosalia, KS to Omaha, NE.

## The Newcomers:

Mary Bisbee: Stepped up to be our manager when we needed one. She did a great job and fit right in with the group.
Sarah Harris: In her first year in cross country, she started out running a 1 mile in 16:12. She came a long way this season and dropped her mile time down to 12:56 and medaled $17^{\text {th }}$ in her last JV race of the year.
Justin Lamb: Was the cross country manager last year. He traded in the water bottles for running shoes this year. Just dropped his 2 mile time from 25:38 to 16:57. His best 5 K time was $30: 01$. Big improvement in the short season.
Bradon Totty: Was the top newcomer of the year. He improved his 5 K time from 29:48 to 22:07, which landed him second fastest boy on the team. He was still dropping minutes off his time at the end of the season.

## The Returners:

Kolton Melugin: Improved his 5K time from 29:07 to 22:32. He too was dropping big time at the end of the season. Kolton seems way too calm when he runs. I cannot wait to see what he can do when we get him out of his comfort zone.
Chaz Ratcliff: Improved his 5 K time from 23:06 to 19:28. He was a mere 17 seconds short of making it to the State Meet this year. I do believe Chaz is back to his running skills before he had knee surgery. He will be looking to stamp his ticket to state next year as a senior. He also was the $4^{\text {th }}$ Place finisher for SCBL meet.

## The Senior:

Tyler Melugin: Came into the season with the fastest 2 mile time of the group. Unfortunately he had to have knee surgery on his knee on August $31^{\text {st }}$. He battled back and completed a 5 k at Harvey Lake on September $29^{\text {th }}$, less than a month after surgery. He was unable to get his time down to compete at regionals this year. He does have one of the fastest 5 K times in school history of 18:09.

## The State Qualifier:

Ashley Melugin: Has continued her streak in Cross Country. She medaled in 5 meets this year: Burlington Classic $13^{\text {th }}$, Lyndon Invitational $8^{\text {th }}$, Burlington Invitational $22^{\text {nd }}$, South Central Border League $2^{\text {nd }}$, and $2 A$ Regional $3^{\text {rd }}$. She ran at the State Cross Country Meet on October $29^{\text {th }}$ and finished $28^{\text {th }}$ out of 101 . She missed medaling at state by 25 seconds. She broke the school record, which she set last year and now holds the record for the 5 K with a time of 21:44.

I am proud of all the runners this year. What makes this sport great is that each week you not only have other competitors but you also get a chance to compete against yourself. With the times still dropping at the end of the season, I know that we can go faster. We just need to start sooner with some summer running. I enjoyed you all this season and want to thank you all for the hard work you put into the season.
