FHS DUET ACTING SUPERIOR RATING AT INTERNATIONALS!

Flinthills High School 2017 Seniors, Cody Alvord and Holton Nelson, received a "Superior Rating" at the International Thespian Conference, which is the highest rating possible. The two young men represented Kansas in Duet Acting after qualifying for Nationals at the state conference. A superior rating at Internationals is rare. One hundred and fifty Duet Acts competed and only a handful were deemed as superior. Several observers made a point of telling Cody and Holton that their duet act "raised the bar" in their competition round.

The International Thespian Conference does not separate performers by school size. The competition spans all students on equal terms. Cody and Holton proved that their acting expertise is comparable to private performing arts schools, and 6A schools across the country who were also competing at the

June 19 - June 26 five Flinthills students had the opportunity to compete in the National TSA competition in Orlando, Florida. Alyssa Howard & Trey McNemee competed with their video on Digital Citizenship, which placed 4th in the state competition. Hadley Girty competed in Architectural Design which was the state champion with his tiny house project. Caden Sangals, Hunter Travnichek & Alyssa Howard competed in Technology Bowl. While none of them broke into semi-finals they competed hard in an event which consisted of 8000 middle school and high school competitors from all 50 states, as well as Turkey, Hungary, and China. Hadley & Caden had the opportunity to participate in a national parliamentary procedure as our local voting delegates. I was extremely proud of all of my members for their efforts at every competition they participated in.

Taking advantage of any downtime we could find we explored our surroundings. We rode the Eye of Orlando, a 400 foot high ferris wheel that took 23 minutes to complete one full rotation. We saw a piece of the Berlin Wall at Universal Studios, and spent one afternoon at Daytona Beach. We also stopped briefly at the Grand Ole Opry and shopped at the largest Bass Pro in Memphis on our travels to and from Orlando.

Contact Stephanie Girty at 620-476-2237 with questions or to request an application be sent. Below are some common questions and answers to help you with the application process.

- 1. WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS?
 - All children in households receiving benefits from Food Assistance (FA), the Food Distribution
 Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) or Temporary Assistance for Families (TAF) are
 eligible for free meals.
 - Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
 - Children participating in their school's Head Start/Even Start program are eligible for free meals.
 - Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
 - Children may receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is within the limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this chart.

- 2. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILDREN QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY? Do the members of your household lack a permanent address? Are you staying together in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing arrangement? Does your family relocate on a seasonal basis? Are any children living with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household? If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and haven't been told your children will get free meals, please call or e-mail Bryna Boldra, homeless liaison or migrant coordinator.
- 3. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. Use one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to: Stephanie Girty, 806 SE Rosalia Road, Rosalia, KS 67132, phone 620-476-2237.
- 4. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE ALREADY APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS? No, but please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. If any children in your household were missing from your eligibility notification, contact Stephanie Girty, 806 SE Rosalia Road, Rosalia, KS 67132, phone 620-476-2237, s.girty@usd492.org immediately.

- 5. CAN I APPLY ONLINE? Not Available ⊠, Yes ☐ You are encouraged to complete an online application instead of a paper application if you are able. The online application has the same requirements and will ask you for the same information as the paper application. Visit to begin or TO learn more about the online application process. Contact if you have any questions about the online application.
- 6. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT A NEW ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year, through October 6, 2017. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year. If you do not send in a new application that is approved by the school or you have not been notified that your child is eligible for free meals, your child will be charged the full price for meals.
- 7. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please send in an application.
- 8. WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the household income you report.
- 9. IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.
- WHAT IF I DISAGREE WITH THE SCHOOL'S DECISION ABOUT MY APPLICATION? You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to: Jeremy Boldra, 806 SE Rosalia Road, Rosalia, KS 67132, 620-476-2237, j.boldra@usd492.org.
- 11. MAY I APPLY IF SOMEONE IN MY HOUSEHOLD IS NOT A U.S. CITIZEN? Yes. You, your children, or other household members do not have to be U.S. citizens to apply for free or reduced price meals.
- 12. WHAT IF MY INCOME IS NOT ALWAYS THE SAME? List the amount that you <u>normally</u> receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
- 13. WHAT IF SOME HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS HAVE NO INCOME TO REPORT? Household members may not receive some types of income we ask you to report on the application, or may not receive income at all. Whenever this happens, please write a 0 in the field. However, if any income fields are left empty or blank, those will also be counted as zeroes. Please be careful when leaving income fields blank, as we will assume you meant to do so.
- 14. WE ARE IN THE MILITARY. DO WE REPORT OUR INCOME DIFFERENTLY? Your basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. If you get any cash value allowances for off-base housing, food, or clothing, it must also be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Any additional combat pay resulting from deployment is also excluded from income.
- 15. WHAT IF THERE ISN'T ENOUGH SPACE ON THE APPLICATION FOR MY FAMILY? List any additional household members on a separate piece of paper, and attach it to your application. - 16. MY FAMILY NEEDS MORE HELP. ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAMS WE MIGHT APPLY FOR? To find out how to apply for Food Assistance (FA) or other assistance benefits, contact your local assistance office or call 1-888-369-4777.
