## Leaving a Legacy

For several years students at Flinthills have created legacy art. Legacy art is artwork that is created for a specific space and/or intended to be left at a certain location.

When you walk into the high school the first and largest legacy work is the tile Mustang mural. I spent 3 years having all students, staff & community patrons create a tile before assembling it on the wall one summer. I chose this wall because it was an orange brick wall and I wanted our school colors to be the first thing visitors noticed. This mural was funded through our Place-Based grant where we focused on learning about our community and the prairie.



In the west gym is the scorer's table which was painted by high school art students who chose this project because the West gym was overshadowed visually by the newer East gym.

Walking down the Library hallway you'll see the 7 traits that year's middle school art class wished to see in our student body. They learned to create the frames, stretch the canvas and collaborate so all the paintings worked together collaboratively.

The Intermediate school has their own collaborative paintings where each class creates a painting that every student has a hand in creating. These are hung above the lockers in the hallway.

The last collaborative paintings occur around this time every spring, where Seniors leave their mark by painting a brick in the art room. I love seeing students thoughtfully choose their brick & ponder what image they want to tell their story.

My own legacy work is not the images I leave on the walls but that my students remember me as a teacher who loved them, that life could be full of fun and laughter, and that I believed they could do anything.

Congratulations to Stephanie! She will receive a Flinthills' Certificate and a Messenger Bag.

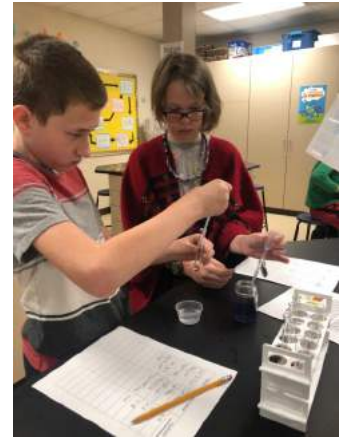


# Classes—Where the Learning Begins

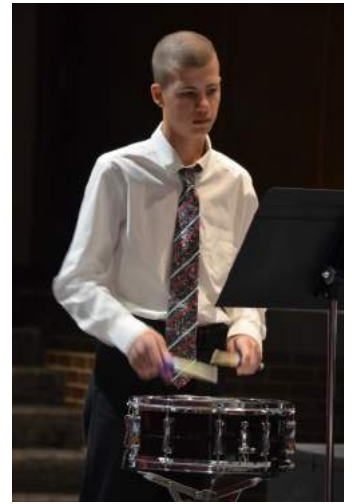

### CLARK ONE OF TOP SIXTEEN RIDERS IN NATION

Flinthills High School Junior Megan Clark earned a spot as one of the top 16 horse riders in the nation in the class called "Equitation on the Flat Walk/Trot." She qualified at the National Finals in Perry, Georgia, after winning the Regional and Zone Regional competitions.

Although Megan grew up around horses, she only really started riding after moving back from Hawaii two years ago. About a year ago, she started riding English style which is different from the more common (in this area) Western style. Western riding events include barrel racing, roping, rodeo, etc. while English riding includes events like jumping, dressage, etc. Western saddles are big with saddle horns and are built to comfortably hold the rider in the saddle while English saddles are flat and require more muscle to hold the rider in place.



She rides for the Windy Fox Farm and competes in a category called IEA which means she goes to the show where the hosts draw names to see which horse each person will ride. It will be a horse she has never seen or ridden before.

She had tons of fun and looks forward to next year.

# FHS FORENSICS TEAM PLACES AT STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS!

The Flinthills High School Forensics Team fought hard among the top four of 28 schools at the KSHSAA Forensics Virtual State Championship on May 1<sup>st</sup> for Top Placings. After five rounds of pre-lems, semi-finals (Top 12) and finals (Top 6) in each event, The Winners were announced. Flinthills qualified 13 events for State while Kiowa and Pretty Prairie competed with maximum state entries of 16 events. Sylvan-Lucas competed with 15 events. After all final scores were in, Flinthills placed 3<sup>rd</sup> with Kiowa in 1<sup>st</sup>, Sylvan-Lucas 2<sup>nd</sup> and Pretty Prairie 4<sup>th</sup>. Our Flinthills Team was thrilled to accomplish 3<sup>rd</sup> in the midst of such large and competitive teams! Of the 13 FHS events, which all contributed to the overall win, 10 events broke into Semi-Finals. **Adley Humig** placed close to Semi-Final Ranks in Humorous Solo Acting, **Megan Clark** placed 9<sup>th</sup> overall in Informative Speaking and **Callie Cordts** placed 8<sup>th</sup> overall in Informative Speaking. 8 of those 10 events advanced to Finals: **Kolton Stanfield and Sydney Sorum** in Improvised Duet Acting which placed 6<sup>th</sup> overall, **Cael Sorum and Morgan Holcomb** in Improvised Duet Acting which placed 5<sup>th</sup> overall, **Kaily Gilman** in Poetry which took 4<sup>th</sup> overall, **Cael Sorum and Morgan Holcomb** in Duet Acting which placed 4<sup>th</sup> overall, **Alexis Hatvick** in Original Oration who placed 3<sup>rd</sup> overall, **Laura Scribner** in Extemporaneous Speaking who swiped 2<sup>nd</sup> overall, and **Savannah McCreight** who placed 2<sup>nd</sup> overall in Poetry and 1<sup>st</sup> Place in OO which deems her the “**Kansas 2021 Forensics State Champion**” in Original Oration.

Coach, Julie McCreight, says this year’s FHS Forensics Team is “determined, consistent, and passionate.” She also says, “They truly care about one another’s success and well-being.” The team’s assistant coach is Sandy Bell, Conner Sigg assisted the team with technology, and Yana Taylor is the team’s manager. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Place State Trophy and KSHSAA Medals for the team will be awarded at the High School Academic Assembly.

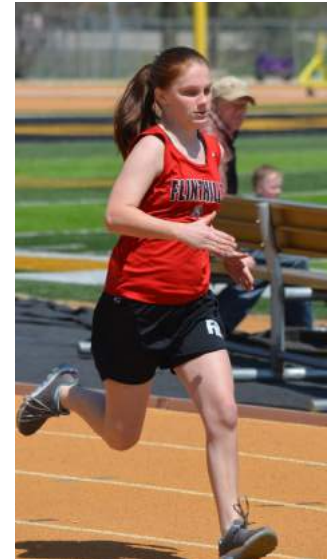

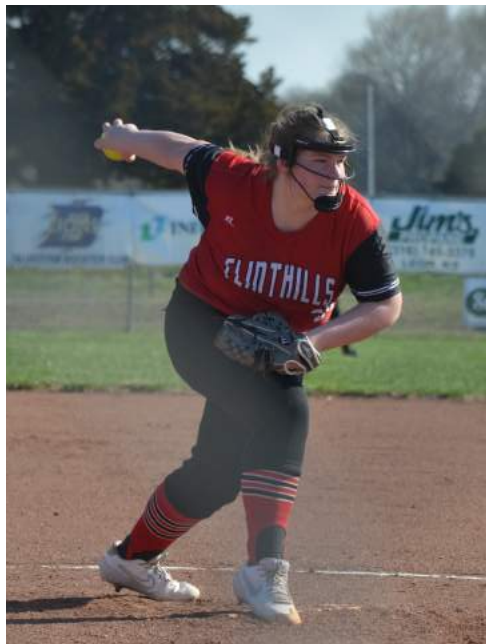

# Flinthills Primary and Intermediate

## Letter from Mr. Gawith, the primary/intermediate principal....

Can we say much about this past year and a half has been normal? While it has been interesting, sometimes frustrating and often confusing, we have adapted and possibly become better in many areas. I think that as a school district, we have learned a great deal and quite possibly many of our new ways are here to stay.

One example of a positive change is reducing the number of entry points we have into the school. This allows us to greet the kids as they enter the building each morning. While we may not be taking their temperatures any more, we are building positive relationships. Another positive from limiting the points of entry is that we do not have Intermediate and Primary students walking through the High School parking lot to get on the bus or enter the building. I think that safety measure is something that we will see continue long after the pandemic has ended.



Google classroom has become widely used in all grades from K-12. Students know how to get on to Google classroom and move around to see what assignments they need to complete or what hasn't been turned in yet. This has been a great tool for teachers to communicate with students when they are gone for a wide variety of reasons.

Zoom has become a tool that changed from one that was hardly used in our school setting to one that is still used and will continue to be used in the future. Having buildings that are 15 miles apart, it is difficult to be in both places at the same time. We have used Zoom to meet with staff and parents, and it has been a great tool in the redesign process we are doing. Many of our presenters have been quarantined or unable to attend our training sessions. They simply Zoom in and it is like they are right in the room with you.

Heightened awareness of hand hygiene has been a big push at school this year. We have emphasized to our staff and our students to wash their hands correctly and often. The use of hand sanitizer has also helped keep kids from getting as many colds and sniffles. I know we will continue this process in our district.



Parents have had more of an awareness to keep their child(ren) at home if they are running a temperature or not feeling well. Before the pandemic it was easy to give them a Tylenol and send them to school so they could go to work for a while before the school called to send them home. This awareness has led to fewer germs at school which has limited the amount spreading of other illnesses in the schools.

We have added air cleaning systems to our HVAC units that continue to clean the air in the buildings. We will be adding ceiling fans that have ultra violet lights attached to them that also kill the germs in the school and filter the air. These will all be staying in the buildings to keep the air clean for years to come.

While things are slowly going back to pre-pandemic ways it has not been without changes to our day to day activities at school and many of these changes will continue to benefit the staff and students for years to come. So the new normal will not be the same as the old normal but, it will all be normal as we end one school year and look to start the next.

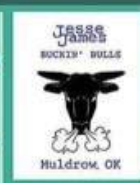
