Veterans Day 2021

Veterans Day is a day that the people of the United States have set aside to pay tribute to all of the American veterans, both living and dead, but especially to honor the living veterans who have served us honorably during both war and peacetime. It was originally called Armistice Day and became a national holiday in 1938. The date is significant because it is the anniversary of the end of World War I. According to History.com, there are approximately 23.2 million military veterans currently in the United States.



Flinthills has an annual celebration to honor our local veterans. This year, we had 20 veterans with local ties to Flinthills and their families in attendance. The veterans processed into the auditorium behind the American flag and each of the armed services flags to Lee Greenwood's recording of "God Bless the USA." The flags were donated by Darrell Lowmaster. Once the veterans were seated, the assembly started with the saying of the Pledge of Allegiance followed by the National Anthem performed by the Flinthills High School Choir directed by Joan Grover.

Next, Kaily Gilman read a portion of the President's

proclamation.

Every year, the Elk's Club sponsors a contest for students to describe what patriotism means to them. Grant Griffin's essay earned second place and Mason Randall's essay earned third place in the seventh and eighth grade division. Grant read his winning essay.

Using pictures from our students' trips to Washington, D.C., Philip Harris compiled a slide show of the memorials in the National Mall. There are over 65 memorials in Washington D.C.

We were honored to have Staff Sergeant Wattana Poboonrueng, an Army Recruiter in Wichita, Kan-

sas, as our guest speaker. His speech titled "Freedom" was very heartfelt and moving. He is originally from Thailand and has been in the Army since 2011. Having experienced life in a different country, he encouraged everyone in attendance to appreciate the freedom we have in the United States. He also talked about the military's role in preserving and protecting our freedom.

Staff Sergeant Poboonrueng's speech was followed by the Flinthills High School Choir's "Salute to our Patriots." As the students sang the anthem from each branch of service, the veterans in attendance came down to the front of the auditorium while their anthem was sung. They received a standing ovation at the conclusion of the song.

From the Desk of Superintendent, Jeremy Boldra

Dear Flinthills Community,

About five years ago, Kansas Commissioner, Randy Watson, traveled the state to seek input from its citizens regarding public schools and what they wanted. He and the State Board set a lofty goal, often compared to a "moon shot," that "Kansas leads the world in the success of each student."

Two years ago, we applied to be considered for the "Apollo II" mission to redesign our school, and we were approved. Last year, several of our teachers across the district along with our principals led this mission to "Redesign" our school with the hope that Flinthills would be a leader within the mission of the Kansas State Board of Education.

Our teachers worked tirelessly to look at ways that they felt would most impact student success. The elementary school teachers decided to focus on Social and Emotional Learning (SEL), Individualized Learning, Project-Based Learning, and to increase parent and community involvement through more "community nights." The middle and secondary school teachers narrowed in on implementing Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) for reading and math, a modified schedule, and Social and Emotional Learning.

On November 15, 2021, Jay Scott from the Kansas Department of Education presented our schools with Banners signaling approval for our "Redesign" program to launch. Implementation of all of our focuses has started, and we are confident that our efforts will start to pay off soon, and that all Flinthills graduates will be set up for success beyond our walls.

The Flinthills staff does a tremendous job of helping our students have academic success at school with differentiated instructional practices throughout the classroom. However, some children need additional support in order to succeed. The Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) is a framework (program) that helps schools and teachers give their students the support they need to learn, develop, and flourish.

The MTSS framework helps schools create ways to:

- Identify each child's needs and provide support based on educational data.
- Use research-based MTSS strategies and interventions.
- Provide strategies to meet each child's needs.
- Regularly check each child's progress to know if instruction, strategies, and interventions area meeting their needs.
- Adjust instruction, strategies, and interventions as needed.

We will be tracking student progress throughout the year to ensure the success of the program. We will assess student's progress in each individual classroom as well as through our benchmark assessment program (Fastbridge) testing system according to the assessment schedule.

Our district is excited to begin the implementation process with our focus areas being in Math and Language Arts strategies. Our staff and faculty have been very diligent working with the MTSS team members ensuring that this program will have both short and long term success for our school district. 

He was Dead Minutes and Lived to Talk About It.

Monday, November 15 the Flinthills SAFE students sponsored Sheila Hasenkamp Keehn to speak to our 7-12 students and staff. Her presentation "8 Minutes" was the personal story of how her son, Parker, binge drank on Spring Break while in college, and how he legally died for 8 minutes. His friend found Parker passed out and immediately called 911.

Several positive things happened that day and in the days that followed that helped Parker fully recover. He and his mother Sheila feel compelled to share the details of that day and the days that followed to hopefully prevent teens from thinking twice about drinking and the impact it can have.

From her flyer Sheila writes "We all know the prevalence of alcohol use among our teens and college students, but the prevailing attitude is that 'it won't happen to me' or 'I wouldn't be that stupid'. They truly believe they are invincible. But we seem to be hearing more and more stories of young people dying due to alcohol poisoning and it is her hope that through 'their story' they will be able to save a life."

Sheila is a former teacher and school counselor, so she was well prepared to speak to our students. Her presentation was very well received. Throughout the day students continued to have discussions based on what they heard and their thoughts on situations they might find themselves in. Being more informed will hopefully help our students make good choices as they maneuver through their teenage years.

If your student attended this presentation ask them about it! The message was powerful and memorable.


MS Girls Basketball Season off to Winning Start

The Character strong word this month was "Gratitude". Students in both buildings worked all month long on ways to show gratitude.






