


Fourth is A Long Petal of the Sea by Isabel Allende, a story about war refugees, displacement, endurance, and love.

Caroline Zancan a novel about three college students who are trying to expose their prestigious professor as a plagiarist. In second place we







The fourth and fifth grade students, who attend Release Time, were treated to a visit from Mr and Mrs Dorsch who were raised here in Kansas but have spent the last 30 years in Africa as missionaries, most recently in Niger. They shared with the students about life in Africa; the culture of the country - what they eat, schools, language, weather, etc. Mrs. Dorsch is showing the "wash cloth" that is used here. (Think loofa.) Mr. Dorsch is sharing the water pots that can be found everywhere for washing. The country of Niger is predominantly Muslim. They speak mostly French. In the city they may only have electricity 3-4 hours a day. The lowest temperature they've had in their 30 years there was about 60 degrees! Days are usually 110-115 degrees. Yikes! Schools are crowded with 70-90 students in a classroom with one teacher and no aides to help. UGH! Students don't have paper, pencils, books or computers. They each have slate and chalk for their lessons. Driving out from the city they can see giraffes up close and personal. A very different lifestyle that makes us appreciate all the wonderful things we have here in good old Kansas.









MS Scholars Bowl Teams Earn League Champs Titles
